## **Connecticut Ranks Among Top 20 States in the Nation for “Insourced” Jobs**

**Washington, DC — September 25, 2007** — With 100,900 employees in Connecticut working for U.S. subsidiaries of companies headquartered abroad, Connecticut ranks 18<sup>th</sup> in the nation in terms of the total number of “insourced” jobs. The Organization for International Investment (OFII) today released new Commerce Department statistics, which show that insourced jobs continue to be an integral part of the U.S. economy.

“Foreign-based companies have paid the Connecticut workforce a huge compliment by choosing to employ tens of thousands of workers in the state,” said Todd Malan, President and CEO of the Organization for International Investment, a Washington, DC-based business group representing U.S. subsidiaries of companies based abroad. “U.S. subsidiaries insource jobs to every state in the country, supporting a total of 5.1 million American jobs and a \$336 billion annual payroll,” Malan stated.

### **Connecticut “Insourcing” Job Facts**

Connecticut ranks 18<sup>th</sup> in the nation in terms of the number of workers employed by U.S. subsidiaries of foreign firms, with a total of 100,900 – providing the livelihood for nearly 7 percent of Connecticut’s private-sector workforce;

Over 25 percent of the insourced jobs in Connecticut are in the manufacturing sector, totaling 26,800 employees;

Insourcing companies in Connecticut include: Alcatel-Lucent, AREVA, Inc., Boehringer Ingelheim, Deutsche Telekom, Fuji Photo Film Inc., GlaxoSmithKline, Philips Electronics North America Corp., Rexam Inc. and XL Capital Group.
