## Indiana Ranks 13<sup>th</sup> in Nation for “Insourced” Jobs

**Washington, DC — September 25, 2007** — With 139,900 Indianans working for U.S. subsidiaries of companies headquartered abroad, Indiana ranks 13<sup>th</sup> in the nation in terms of the total number of “insourced” jobs. The Organization for International Investment (OFII) today released new Commerce Department statistics, which show that insourced jobs continue to be an integral part of the U.S. economy.

“Foreign-based companies have paid the Indiana workforce a huge compliment by choosing to employ tens of thousands of workers in the state,” said Todd Malan, President and CEO of the Organization for International Investment, a Washington, DC-based business group representing U.S. subsidiaries of companies based abroad. “U.S. subsidiaries insource jobs to every state in the country, supporting a total of 5.1 million American jobs and a \$336 billion annual payroll,” Malan stated.

### Indiana “Insourcing” Job Facts

- Indiana ranks 13<sup>th</sup> in the nation in terms of the number of workers employed by U.S. subsidiaries of foreign firms, with a total of 139,900 – providing the livelihood for more than 5 percent of Indiana’s private-sector workforce;
- Overall, 60 percent of the insourced jobs in Indiana are in the manufacturing sector, totaling 83,900 employees;
- Insourcing companies in Indiana include: APL Limited, Bayer Corporation, BP, Bridgestone Americas Holding, Inc., Huhtamaki, Michelin North America, Inc., Swiss Re America Holding Corp., Tate & Lyle North America, Inc. Co., and Toyota Motor North America.
